

THE NEU IS LOOKING FOR A SERVICE OFFICER (DEVELOPMENTAL POSITION)

This is an indeterminate position based in Iqaluit and the successful applicant will work with the NEU Service Officers to learn the full scope of job duties associated with this position.

Preference will be given to Nunavut Land Claim Beneficiaries.

The Service Officer is the main point of contact for NEU Members and some of the main duties are: Ensuring Collective Agreements are respected and Members rights are protected; Providing representation to NEU Members; Organizing Members into well-functioning locals; and Coordinating the active participation in the bargaining process. Salary starts at \$88,009.84 which is equivalent to 80 percent of the Service Officer Rate and a complete northern benefits package is offered. Staff housing is provided.

NEU NEWS UPDATES:

NEU EIGHTH (8th) Triennial Component Convention October 5th through 7th, 2021 Iqaluit Nunavut: As of June, 2021 the plan is to hold the upcoming NEU Convention 'in-person'. The Convention was rescheduled from October 2020 to October 2021 due to COVID-19 health precautions in place last year. Recent Public Service Alliance (PSAC) Conventions have been held virtually. With this in mind, the NEU will have a back-up plan in place to hold the NEU Convention virtually in case of any further COVID-19 related issues.

The NEU President, Executive and staff would like to thank all Members who put their names forth as Regional Vice-President candidates or as a Local Delegates. These individuals will be contacted by NEU President William (Bill) Fennell directly, or, through their Locals as applicable.

NEU Head Office Status Update: The NEU Head Office in Iqaluit reopened Friday June 4, 2021 after being closed since mid-April due to COVID-19 public health concerns and precautions. As part of our office reopening and in-line with mandatory precautions designed to protect the staff, our Members and the general public there are restrictions on the amount of individuals allowed in the building at any given time. With this in mind, the NEU is asking Members to call 979.4209 or email their Service Officer or other NEU representative instead of just 'dropping by'.

We are also asking Members in Cambridge Bay (867.222.2353) and Rankin Inlet (867.645.4258) to call or email when they need to speak to their Service Officer. The NEU thanks our Members for their understanding and patience with this situation and appreciates their efforts in keeping Nunavut safe and healthy.

NEU Officers are open from 8:30 am to 5:00 pm (local times) until June 21st when we switch to summer hours (9:00 am to 5:00 pm) until after Labour Day Weekend.
