



## **City of Iqaluit Bargaining Update #1**

Bargaining with the City of Iqaluit has reached a critical point. While progress has been made on many issues, the Employer's monetary offer is insufficient and disconnected from the realities of a City that has built a sizeable surplus largely on the backs of workers who just suffered through a two-year wage freeze and concessions.

After seven long days of bargaining in December 2020 and February 2021, your Public Service Alliance of Canada (PSAC)/Nunavut Employees Union (NEU) Bargaining Team presented the City with a reasonable deal that provides fair compensation for workers and that meets the City's concerns. The City is taking time to study our proposal and promises to answer within weeks.

Management and other officials have said they are striving to make the City of Iqaluit an '*employer of choice*'. Accepting the fair and balanced deal tabled is a bare minimum required to make good on this promise.
